She came to the USA in 2006 from the Philippines with two sisters, one older, one younger, and started playing golf with The First Tee of Washington DC the next year. Her quiet, steady demeanor proved to be suitable for golf, but she excels at drawing and cooking....yum.

Mike Stafford

After the attacks on September 11, 2001, Sergeant Mike Stafford re-enlisted in the National Guard and was stationed in Iraq. On August 8, 2005, his humvee was struck by a pressure plate IED. His injuries resulted in a below the knee amputation of his left leg. Sergeant Stafford was always an avid golfer, but has become more serious about the sport since his injury. He has won several golf tournaments around the country, including two club championships. Through the Salute Military Golf Association (SMGA), he joined the Golf Channel AM-TOUR and plays in the Nashville, Tennessee bracket. There, he won three tournaments this year and finished first in points. He also plays part-time with the Eastern Amputee Golf Association and has won several tournaments including the Pennsylvania Hanger Open. He is a golf course manager at Okolona Country Club where he oversees the greens, fairways, chemicals, swimming pool, club house and all tournaments. He and his wife, Janna, are the proud parents of two children, Brandon and Kyle.





Pat Devlin

Pat was born in Harrisburg PA, growing up playing football, tennis, and snowboarding. After graduating from Penn State in 2004, he joined the Navy and deployed to Bahrain, doing Anti-Terrorism operations from 2006-2007. In the summer of 2007, he attended BUD/s, graduating in October 2007, becoming a Navy SEAL. He spent five Years at SEAL Team Ten based in Virginia Beach, deploying to Europe, Africa, and Afghanistan. He moved to Chandler, Arizona, to attend the Golf Academy of America where he graduated at the top of his class. He currently works at the Golf Club of Estrella in Goodyear, Arizona. In 2011, Corporal Pfeifer won the National Amputee Championship hosted at Rio Verde Golf Club and the Inaugural George W. Bush Presidential Center Warrior Open. He and his wife, Summer, welcomed their first child, Grady, last June.

Scott Rohrer

Scott is a hard-working, talented young man who focuses on his love of golf and his love of playing with his father, partner and coach, Jeff Rohrer. Chris is married and has a daughter, 26, a son, 21, who is starting his junior year at the US Naval Academy, two stepdaughters, 14 and 12, and one grandson.

His military awards include the Combat Infantryman Badge, Bronze Star Medal, Purple Heart Medal, and Meritorious Service Medal. He is married to Dawn Cash-Salau and is the proud father of two adult children.





Grace Ann Braxton

Grace Anne Braxton, of Fredericksburg, VA is the top ranked female Special Olympics Golfer in the world. A VSGA member, Braxton won her most recent world championship at the 2011 Special Olympics World Summer Games in Athens, Greece. Braxton finished with a 72-hole 383 (96-92-90-105) aggregate to claim the Division I women's competition. She posted her second consecutive victory in the World Games, taking home a 36-stroke triumph in the division last week; she also claimed the world title in 2007 in China by 36 strokes. Braxton has long been a big name in Special Olympics, dating to 1991 when she won a gold medal in swimming at the World Summer Games. She's served four years on the Virginia Special Olympics board of directors, and has been a Special Olympics Virginia athlete since 1982. In addition to her Special Olympics competitions, Braxton finished 12th in the 2010 Virginias Women's Stroke Play Championship.

Nick Cluney

Nick grew up in New England with his parents, brother, and two younger sisters. He went to school at the University of New Hampshire where he swam and received his Bachelors in Business. Following graduation, he joined the Navy on a SEAL contract where it guaranteed him a chance to go to BUD/s training. After completion of training he was selected to join to SEAL Team Ten. Recently, he transitioned to the SEAL Reserves. While on active duty, he served in many different roles including intelligence, human intelligence, communications, and assault team leader. He has deployed to various regions throughout the world in support of Operation Enduring Freedom, most notably an 11-month combat deployment to Afghanistan in 2011-2012 as an Assault Team Leader.

On the morning of January 21, 2011, Sergeant Brooks was entering a hide site when he stepped on a pressure plate IED. As a result, his right leg was amputated up to the knee. He also suffered severe tissue damage to his left leg and underwent a muscle flap and skin grafts to save it, in addition to broken bones in his left foot. He began walking six weeks after his injuries and began playing golf again three months later. Sergeant Brooks has received many awards including the Purple Heart, Navy Achievement Medal with a V for Valor and Combat Action Ribbon. On July 16, 2011, he married his fiancé of four years, Keri, and they currently live in Rockville, Maryland.

Hannah Clark

Hannah Clark recently graduated from high school and will be attending Howard University as a Computer Science major in the fall of 2013. She is an accomplished public speaker and has won numerous oratory competitions as well as performed in several plays. Along with computers, Hannah enjoys golfing, visual arts, crafts, textile arts, and blogging. Hannah has been involved with The First Tee of Washington, DC for over five years and is an Eagle level participant.

Carl Hibbert

Carl Hibbert is a Global Messenger and Special Olympics athlete from North Carolina. Carl started competing for Special Olympics when he was 10 years old. He was recently named the male recipient of the RBS Achiever of the Year Award, which is annually awarded to a First Tee participant, who has overcome a difficult life obstacle. He has won 3 junior events and helped his high school win the 2012 MIAA Team Championship. He plans to study business in college and continue to play golf.

Steve Ogletree
