Tournament Formats

Perfect Sense Pro-Am (Monday, June 26, 2017)

The Perfect Sense Pro-Am is a one-day event played at TPC Potomac at Avenal Farm. The event will be a best ball of the fivesome with a shotgun start at 9:00am (registration opens at 7:00am). Your four-person amateur team will be paired for eighteen holes with a professional. The scoring (with full handicap index) will be a one net best ball of the fivesome. Handicaps will be maxed at 18.

Brightspot Unified Challenge (Wednesday, June 28, 2017)

The Brightspot Unified Challenge is one-day, Ryder Cup style, team event played at Country Club of Fairfax. The event will feature 48 golfers divided into red and blue teams with the first match teeing off at 10:00am (breakfast will be served at 8:30am).

Teams will play two 9-hole matches, using match play scoring. Each match is worth 1 point.

Front Nine — Best Ball Back Nine — Alternate Shot (both partners drive on each hole)

Additionally, there will be a variety of team and individual competitions throughout the round.

- Holes 1-4
 - o Red Ball (Foursome) On each hole, one golfer plays with a red ball. Over the 4 holes, each player in the foursome will have the red ball once. The team score is the score from the red ball plus the lowest score from the other 3 balls in play.
- Hole 5
 - o Longest Drive (Individual)
- Holes 7-9
 - o Cha-Cha-Cha (Foursome) On the 7th hole, count the lowest ball; on the 8th hole; count the two lowest balls; on the 9th hole, count the three lowest balls.
- Hole 13
 - o Closest to the Pin (Individual)
- Hole 15
 - o Closest in 2 (Pairing)
- Hole 18
 - o Team Drive (Foursome) We will measure the distance of all drives in the fairway. The team with the highest sum wins.

Thomas J. Brooks (TJ) is a retired OIF-OEF wounded veteran of the United States Marine Corps. Sergeant Brooks joined the Marine Corps in June of 2006. He completed two deployments to the Al Anbar Province in Iraq and one deployment to the Helmand Province in Afghanistan, serving as a Scout Sniper. His military awards include the Purple Heart and the Navy and Marine Corps Achievements Medal with a V for Valor. He was injured as a result of a pressure plate improvised explosive device while conducting missions in Afghanistan. Injuries resulting in IED blast are right leg amputation above the knee, severe muscle and tissue damage to the left leg below the knee, TBI, and PTSD. During his recovery at Walter Reed he became an active participant in The Salute Military Golf Association. Sergeant Brooks retired from the Marine Corps due to his wounds on November 29, 2012. Sergeant Brooks is currently attending Baylor University.



Brice Smoker

He serves as a member of his chapter's Junior Leadership Community and is a junior coach. He deployed to Afghanistan, Iraq, and Central America, for a combined total of over 4 years in service abroad. Born and raised in Cumberland, Kentucky, Chris' father taught him the game of golf at the age of 10. Currently, he is a contractor for the Special Forces Medical Sergeant's course at Fort Bragg, NC where he passes on his experience and knowledge to future green berets. Dillon Behr


Ben Deutsch
